### Program Length

We offer six weeks of summer program options from June 8 – July 17, 2020. Camps and classes are offered in one to five week blocks.

### Daily Schedule

The day includes half (9:00 am – 12:00 pm, 1:00 pm – 4:00 pm) and full day (9:00 am – 4:00 pm) sessions, before and after-school care, and a supervised lunch.

### Registration

You will receive an immediate electronic confirmation that your registration has been received. All registrations are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. Once a class is full, there is

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an option to be added to a waitlist. **Grade levels printed in the course descriptions indicate grades that students will enter in Fall 2020.**

## Online Registration Process

We are excited to offer online registration for our Summer Program. Please note some vendor programs require online registration on their organization's website (check course description).

2. View the course offerings and make your selections.
3. You will be asked to set up an account with our provider, Active Network.
4. Complete the Medical Authorization, Photo Authorization, and Waivers.
5. Pay by credit card or echeck.
6. You will receive an automated email that your registration has been received. Any additional information will be emailed prior to the start of the course.

## Tuition and Cancellation/Withdrawal

All tuition payments are made online during registration. Please see class descriptions for program fees. Courses with insufficient enrollment will be canceled no later than June 1, and a full refund of tuition will be made. Those cancelling or withdrawing from a class will be subject to a fee of 10% of the total tuition or \$50.00, whichever is greater. No refunds will be made after June 8. Optional registration insurance is also available (see online registration form for more information). Lake Ridge Academy reserves the right to dismiss a student for inappropriate behavior with no refund for the tuition paid.

## Extended Day

Before and after-school supervision is available for a fee of \$8.00 per hour. Extended Day times are from 8:00 am – 9:00 am and from 4:00 pm – 5:30 pm. Students remaining in Extended Day past 5:30 pm will incur a late fee at a rate of \$1 per minute. Extended Day is operated by experienced Lake Ridge Academy faculty and staff. You may register for Extended Day as the need arises. Billing is handled through the Business Office.

## Health & Wellness

During the Summer Program, there is NO NURSE on duty. In the event of an emergency, 911 will be contacted.

## Lunch/Snacks

Parents are responsible for providing their child with a lunch (including beverage). Refrigeration is available. Morning and afternoon snacks are provided by Lake Ridge Academy.

## Class Size

Personalized attention is an important feature of the Summer Program; therefore, class size is limited and set by the Summer Program Director.

## Instructors

Most summer programs are taught by Lake Ridge Academy faculty. All of our instructors are certified teaching professionals or highly experienced in their field of instruction. In many programs, a Lake Ridge Academy Upper School student or graduate will serve as a counselor/assistant.

## Field Trips

Several camps and classes will be taking field trips. Parents will be informed of the trip destination prior to the day of the trip. Field trips are chaperoned by Lake Ridge Academy staff and transportation is provided.

## Campus Directions

All campers should check-in for their camp or class at our main entrance located in the Community Resource Center (CRC). The CRC is the two-story brick building located on the west side of our campus. Take the first right-hand turn after crossing the bridge. This road will lead you to the large parking lot in front of the CRC entrance which is located under the large metal awning.

## CODEMONSTER CODING CAMPS

### Arduino Robotics Camp

Arduino robotics programming will be entirely new and different from the previous year. We will build a working robot that kids can bring home at the end of the camp and program it intuitively using a real programming language.

This one-of-a-kind course teaches kids robotic programming using a unique approach. We first introduce and discuss all components needed for the robot build before actually building it. Once the robot is completed, we will program the robot to give it intelligence!

This robotics class is fun and engaging while providing a learning experience for kids who love to build and code. We will use an open-sourced platform for our robotic building and C++ for coding. No prior knowledge of robotic programming is required for this course. Some form of coding like Scratch or equivalent is preferred.

### Graphical Robotics Jr. Programming

Robotics programming is NOT only for big kids. Younger kids can build and code a robot as well. They will bring home a fully working robotic rover at the end of the camp.

We first introduce and discuss all components needed for the robot build before actually building it. We will discuss the everyday robotics technology around us and understand their implementation. The kids will build a simple robotic rover with fewer parts and program it with intuitive graphical blocks similar to Scratch. The microcontroller board used in this camp is the BBC Microbit.

No prior knowledge of robotic programming is required for this course. Some form of coding like Scratch or equivalent is preferred.

Instead of just playing games on the iPad, students can learn how to create their own games by dragging and dropping LEGO-styled blocks on the screen. This class will improve students' critical thinking, logic, and creativity. Campers will also focus on algorithm and logic thinking using pseudocoding, explore the advantage of reusable codes using functions, and improve their knowledge on technical jargon.

No prior knowledge of computer programming is required; however, students should know how to use the touch screen to navigate around the screen.

Scratch 3.0 is the third and current major version of Scratch. It is a complete redesign and re-implementation of Scratch, a programming platform developed by MIT for children. All relevant concepts of programming language can be demonstrated in Scratch in a very kid-friendly environment. Scratch will build coding interest in kids through games and animations.

BBC Microbit is a small microcontroller board that can be programmed to do a number of nifty things. Kids will learn how to write simple games using Scratch and program the Microbit as a game controller.

No prior knowledge of computer programming required. Students should know how to use the mouse to navigate around the computer screen.
